1 Underlying principles of language certificate tests and levels

1.1 Creating a common reference level for European languages

• Already in the 80s, in a world that was becoming more globalized by the second, the UN council started developing the idea of a common framework for assessing language proficiency of individuals and establish the **Common European Framework of Reference for Languages** (CEFR)

• The **CEFR** allowed an **easier** and **coherent** understanding of one's level across languages thanks to abstract **descriptors** that divide language proficiency levels in 6 steps (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2).

This made self-assessment much easier.

LEVEL	Listening
A1	 Can understand and use common everyday expressions and basic phrases to meet specific needs. Can introduce themselves and others and ask and answer questions about personal details such as their residence, acquaintances, and possessions. Can engage in simple interactions if the other person speaks slowly and clearly and is willing to assist.
A2	 Can comprehend sentences and commonly used expressions relevant to immediate needs (e.g., basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment). Can engage in simple and routine tasks that require straightforward and direct exchanges of information on familiar and routine topics. Can describe basic aspects of their background, immediate environment, and areas of immediate need in simple terms.
B1	 Can comprehend the main points of clear, standard communication on familiar topics commonly encountered at work, school, or during leisure activities. Can handle most situations that are likely to occur while traveling in regions where the language is spoken. Can create simple, coherent text on topics that are familiar or personally interesting. Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes, and ambitions, and can briefly explain opinions and plans.
B2	 Can comprehend the main ideas in complex texts on both concrete and abstract subjects, including technical discussions within their area of expertise. Can engage in conversations with native speakers fluently and spontaneously, ensuring smooth interactions without effort for either participant. Can write clear, detailed texts on various topics and articulate a viewpoint on current issues, outlining the pros and cons of different options.



C1	 Can comprehend a broad spectrum of demanding, extended clauses and discern implicit meanings. Can convey ideas fluently and spontaneously with minimal hesitation in finding expressions. Can utilize language flexibly and effectively for social, academic, and professional contexts. Can generate clear, well-structured, detailed text on complex topics, demonstrating controlled use of organizational patterns, connectors, and cohesive devices.
C2	 Can effortlessly comprehend nearly everything heard or read. Can summarize information from various spoken and written sources, reconstructing arguments, and narratives into a coherent presentation. Can express themselves spontaneously, with exceptional fluency and precision, distinguishing subtle nuances of meaning even in the most complex situations.

2 Our test's format and grading

2.1 Our test's format

Our tests are divided into **4 sections**, each corresponding to one or two of **the primary linguistic competencies**: speaking & interacting, listening comprehension, reading comprehension, grammar mastery, writing.
